

December Highlights:

KATHY PORTER

In a success story as radical as her first science fiction novel, SCWA's Kathy Porter has rocketed from a POD [Print-on-Demand] launch pad into the atmosphere of an independent publisher on her way to two stellar landings: Winner of an Indie Excellence Book Award and a National Best Books Award by USA Book News. Sold out for this region, *Earth's Ultimate Conflict* is only the first of Porter's Gray Guardians Series. Her topic was "Getting Your Published Work into a Bookstore."

Porter's goal in writing *Earth's Ultimate Conflict* was to draw female readers to the male-driven sci-fi/fantasy genre. She features strong women, including the USA President, who confront enormous challenges. When working on this novel, Porter purposely made connections with SCWA speakers and others associated with her genre. As a result, not only did she gain an endorsement by Ray Bradbury but her novel tops the pile on the desk of Dean Devlin, Hollywood director, producer, and writer.



Meanwhile, Porter established an online presence, created flyers, and entered her novel into book awards contests, becoming a winner in two of them! Her colorful, attractive flyers feature a photo of Porter above a bio featuring how she fell in love with science fiction. To the right is a synopsis of *Earth's Ultimate Conflict* under a photo of the novel, followed by eminent endorsements, such as Bradbury's. After winning awards, Porter attached stickers with the awards' names onto the flyers. Next, she designed and ordered 5,000 bookmarks from Willy Walt Printing Services in Florida for \$135 plus taxes and shipping.

Porter's next piece of ammunition was letters of introduction for her trips to the book stores. These "Meet Kathy Porter" sheets are personalized for the Community Relations Managers at Barnes & Noble and the Events Managers at Border's. They include specifics on how and from whom her novel is available and state that copies are returnable. They ask for a meet-and-greet date and pitch how her genre is increasingly popular, how the store will be promoting a local award winner, how her sales background will make her assertive and proactive with potential readers, how her website and online presence will reach out, and that the store will be listed on her book tour. "You won't regret it and your customers will love the book." Her contact info is listed. When face-to-face, Porter says, "When can we schedule a meet-and-greet?"

Before leaving, Porter asks which employee is most likely to read sci-fi. She then endorses a copy for that person and leaves a book-selling sheet for orders plus many flyers and bookmarks, which she also scatters on the sci-fi shelves and in the coffee shop.

On the day of the meet-and-greet (not a signing), Porter has her "elevator speech" and other positive "blurbs" clearly in her mind while carrying a small bag with a change of shoes, protein snacks, and enough personal supplies to maintain herself at the store doorway for hours. She also re-sprinkles the coffee shop and register counters with bookmarks.

At her display table, Porter's literature and setups face both ways, for shoppers coming and going. She even places some displays on the floor for those who avoid her eye contact by looking down. "The managers have

to see you're actively engaging incomers or your books won't stay six weeks on the shelf." If this dynamo must leave her station for the restroom, she tells personnel she'll "be right back." Porter's last advice: "Never leave a store without getting re-scheduled."


Laurel Corona

Laurel Corona began her career as a published author in 1999 with a book on Kenya for Lucent Books, and went on to write seventeen Young Adult titles for that company before turning her attention to books for adults. In 2008 she had award-winning debuts with major publishers in both fiction and non-fiction. *The Four Seasons: A Novel of Vivaldi's Venice* (Hyperion/VOICE 2008) won the 2009 Theodor Geisel Award and has been translated into eleven foreign languages. *Until our Last Breath: A Holocaust Story of Love and Partisan Resistance* (St. Martin's Press 2008) received a Christopher Medal. Penguin/Berkley released Laurel's second novel, *Penelope's Daughter*, in October 2010. Her third, *Finding Emilie*, comes out in May 2011 from Simon & Schuster/Gallery Books.



Edward Humes

A journalist and author of ten nonfiction books, Edward Humes received a Pulitzer Prize for his newspaper coverage of the military and a PEN Center USA Award for his book, *No Matter How Loud I Shout: A Year In the Life of Juvenile Court*. His latest books are *Monkey Girl: Evolution, Education, Religion, and the Battle for America's Soul*, which is currently in development at HBO, as well as *Eco Barons: The Dreamers, Schemers & Millionaires Who are Saving Our Planet*. His next book, *Force of Nature*, will be published in spring 2011.
