May 19th Speaker - Eric Beetner "How to be a more prolific writer"



Eric writes hardboiled crime fiction. He's been nominated for two Anthony Awards, an ITW award, a Derringer and even won a few awards like the 2012 Stalker award for Most Criminally Underrated author.

His books include *Rumrunners* and its prequel - the Anthony Award nominated *Leadfoot*, *The Devil Doesn't Want Me*, *When The Devil Comes To Call* and book 3 in the trilogy, *The Devil At Your Door* (out in 2018), *Criminal Economics*, *Dig Two Graves*, *White Hot Pistol*, *The Year I Died Seven Times*, *Stripper Pole At The End Of The World* & the story collection, *A Bouquet Of Bullets*.

He's co-authored *The Backlist*, *The Short List* and *The Getaway List* (2018) with Frank Zafiro and also (with JB Kohl) the novels *One Too Many Blows To The Head* and *Borrowed Trouble* and the standalone novel *Over Their Heads*. He's also written two novellas in the popular Fightcard series, *Split Decision* and *A Mouth Full Of Blood* and two novellas in The Lawyer series of Westerns.

He lives in Los Angeles where, among other things, he co-hosts the Noir At The Bar reading series and the podcast Writer Types.

He's toured as a musician, painted, written screenplays, acted in short films, been to China twice, fished in the Mississippi, once met Barry Manilow, directed films and music videos, his name's been on TV over a hundred times, he owns a real human skull and his kids think he embarrasses them.

March Meeting Highlights - Elaine Ash "Award-winning story and narrative structure"



Elaine Ash celebrated a boisterous St. Patrick's Day with SCWA members by presenting "Award Winning Story and Narrative Structure." When not writing in her own "hard-hitting crime" genre, she helps established authors and emerging talent in shaping manuscripts, acquiring agents, landing publishing deals, while still finding time to lead workshops and moderate conference panels.

All these writing activities have enabled her to compile data for her latest publication: *Bestseller Metrics: How to Win the Novel Writing Game.* It is a "self-editing workbook" on its way to "becoming software, maybe an app." It's "a writer's tool." Ms. Ash's handout explains its origin:

"Starting in 2015, I accidentally discovered that by isolating and studying the first and last quarters of highly successful novels, amazing similarities were evident. Although there is no fixed number of characters that makes up a bestselling novel (what a relief!) the first and last quarters were extremely predictable.

"A pattern emerged that seemed crucial to how well readers could understand and follow any story."

Examining books with millions of sales and lasting influence, from the early 1900s to the present day, Ash counted the numbers of characters in each quarter of the outstanding books in all genres. ("Word counts range from 65,000 to about 146,000 words.") The term *characters* means everybody who appears, even "a talking rock," is "name-dropped" or in a flashback. "In *The Hunger Games*, the crowd, an aggregate, counts as one until someone is singled out."

Examples of what she found: The first quarter of the Thriller *Gone Girl* has 53 characters but only 13 in the last quarter. Those beginning and ending numbers for Chick Lit *The Devil Wears Prada* are 39 to 12. For *Lady Chatterley's Lover*, Literary Erotica, they are 37 to 8. The most extreme drop appears in *Interview with the Vampire*, 30 to 4, simply because the vampires "ate a bunch." Ash's handout says, "A low number may also indicate an absence of subplots that serve to keep interest high on a number of levels."

Thus, it seems that core characters carry through from the first quarter to the end. "We want characters we know at the end." Also, "has the reader had enough chance to bond with them?" Warning: "If the arch villain shows up only at the end, he needs to have been mentioned all along."

Member Annie Moose asked, "What about a beloved character who is no longer with us? He's deceased but still lives in the character's mind." Ms. Ash responded, "Find ways to insert him when meaningful."

Bestseller Metrics evidently also shows some breakdown of story structure and "the timing when the important characters show up," but those factors were not discussed.

Ms. Ash also provided examples of "The Feather Edit," which is often needed. The handout explains: "The danger in meeting character after character lies in overloading readers with names that drop in and drop out, making it hard to remember them down the line." The Feather Edit "aids readers with unobtrusive reminders" of identification so they won't have to skim prior pages to locate when this character first appeared. It may be as easy as slipping in his/her title, position, or relationship to whoever is present. Sometimes, however, more detail is needed.

The addition here **in bold was added** to identify a character named Conway in *Pine Box Pin-Up* by Frank De Blasé:

"I wasn't sure if anyone would answer when I called Conways's office. Obviously, Conway wouldn't, now that he was drying off on a slab at the morgue after his swan dive into the river, but maybe he had a partner, an assistant, a secretary, anybody who could shed some light."

Elaine Ash's own crime writing includes "Hard Bite" that *Spinetingler Magazine* named Best Short Story on the Web in 2009. Ash's novel version, *Hard Bite*, received a Readers" Choice Award in 2012 from Canada's House of Crime and Mystery as did its sequel, *Bite Harder*. [Ash was born and grew up in Eastern Canada.] The first was also one of the Top 5 Debut Novels of 2013 by Book People/ Mystery People. These works are about "a paraplegic who unleashes payback on hit and run drivers with a little help from his monkey." It is being considered for film.


